A Novice Idea

This is the time of year when the Spring Show buzz begins. Everyone is preparing to show their best and brightest. Mot beginning growers are reluctant to participate due to their inexperience. Reasons for not entering usually include: "Is my plant good enough?", "Surely someone's is better than mine.", "What class do I enter it in?", and, "What's a class?" If your blooming plant is beautiful to your eye, it's good enough. Showing plants allows you to see other plants and to compare these to yours. It is the experience you need to learn. The registration desk will assist you in choosing a class. If nothing else, grab a judge! Ask their opinion on the best class. Always start in a lower class. If the judges fell it should be moved to the next higher class, they will do it during judging.

Preparing your plants should begin now. Check for unwanted critters. Treat them now and continue to observe. **DO NOT ENTER A** PLANT WITH BUGS! Also, a common misconception is to repot your plant thinking it will 'look' better in fresh bark. This could shock the plant and cause damage to your developing blooms. If it makes you feel better, add a small amount of fresh bark to the top. Remove any dead leaves from the plant. These are usually the ones closest to the base of the plant. Judging is done ONLY on the bloom or number of blooms unless it is being considered for a special award or AOS Award.

1. You will want to stake your plant to enhance the arch of the inflorescence. All major orchid vendors see various lengths of wire with hooked ends to help support the stems. Paphs will generally be staked straight up, while phals will arch forward. Choose a stake that holds the blooms high enough to be easily seen without giving an unnatural appearance. Mounted inflorescences are not usually staked.

The day you bring your plant, wipe the leaves of any dust or water spots. I have heard the leaf shine sold in stores is not recommended, however, I know several prominent growers that use it without problems. I use WHOLE MILK on a cotton ball! That's right! The lactic acid in the milk will help to dissipate the water spots and the fat in the milk will give a slight sheen that is not harmful and does give a pleasant appearance. Remember, judges are judging the blooms, not the leaves.

When transporting your plant to the Show, place it in a box large enough to hold the pot plus some. I tape wooden stakes in each of the 4 corners of the box so it acts as a frame for the covering. The large industrial size garbage bags will

generally fit right over this. Pack some newspaper around the pot to keep it from sliding. You may need to add extra stakes to the stems for stability during shipping. It helps reduce some of the bouncing that can occur in transport. If you bloom is damaged in transport, bring the plant AND bloom anyway. It can still be judged.

Finally, volunteer. You will learn so much in these few days about orchid growing, care, and unusual orchids that are rarely seen. Good Luck and Happy Growing!

A packed house was in

attendance at our January meeting to hear DR. AZHAR MUSTAFA of A & P ORCHIDS talk about his paphs and their breeding. Those eighty or ninty people were not disappointed in what they heard and saw. We had one great presentation.

And now to drastically change the subject.

Plans for our Spring Show are well under way. I spoke with Show Chair, SOPHIA HARRIS, shortly after our January meting, ans she reported that she had already received acceptances from about 25 exhibitors. We have also hear from several volunteers who have asked to help.

As you may remember from last month's Newsletter, set-up for this year's Spring Show will begin on Friday afternoon. This means that there will likely be a crunch in getting cars, trucks and vans unpacked and plants placed properly in their exhibit and sales areas.

Another possible complicating feature this year is the fact that there is no longer a parking lot near the exhibit. Exhibitors will have to unload and drive down to one of the main lots to park. You WILL NOT be able to park near the exhibit hall simply because there will be no lot in which to park.

For me, the last two paragraphs imply that we will need more people for the traffice committee on Friday for set-up and on Sunday for tear-down. We will also need more people to help with plant registration on Friday afternoon/Friday evening so that the plants can be entered for judging.

To the point on plant entries, a great deal of time can be saved if exhibitors fill our the entry tags before coming to the Garden. The exhibit and exhibitor numbers can easily be added once you are there. If you would like some entry tags prior to the Show please call me or Sophia. Similarly, plant name tags can usually be prepared before coming to the Garden.
