THE IOS Display

We need flowers and lots of flowers. I say we because it's the **ILLINOIS ORCHID SOCIETY DISPLAY!** Make my job really hard. My dream is if every member provides at least one plant we will have trouble finding a place for them. It will look fantastic! There are a few simple rules everyone should follow:

1) NO BUGS! NO BUGS! NO BUGS! I will reject any plants with visitors.

2) Tape your name on the pot, label or on some permanent part of the plant. If your label comes off, the plant is mine (and any ribbons or awards you have won).

3) Stake any long stems. I know of several stems broken because the supports were too short.

4) Water your plants thoroughly; they will be in the display for 6 days. If it is

mounted on something requiring watering more often, let me know. I can spray or water them if I know.

5) Label of species or hybrid should be legible.

6) You can drop off plants at the garden Tuesday, 9am - 9pm and Wednesday 9am-noon. Or, drop off at my house before Tuesday. I'm at 430 Addison, Elmhurst, IL. That's spitting distance from the Tri-Stae and the Ike Extension.

7) Pick up of plants is after 5pm on Sunday. If you can't claim your plants, let me know.

Okay, there's more than a few rules, but they are there to protect you plants and to amke sure you get them back. One last request....do you drink really good champagne? We need the bottle and cork (all I know is the good stuff doesn't have a pull top).

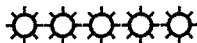
There are also great indepth articles like those on Pleione (with fabulous photos), D r a c u l a s , Masdevallia, Phrags, and more.

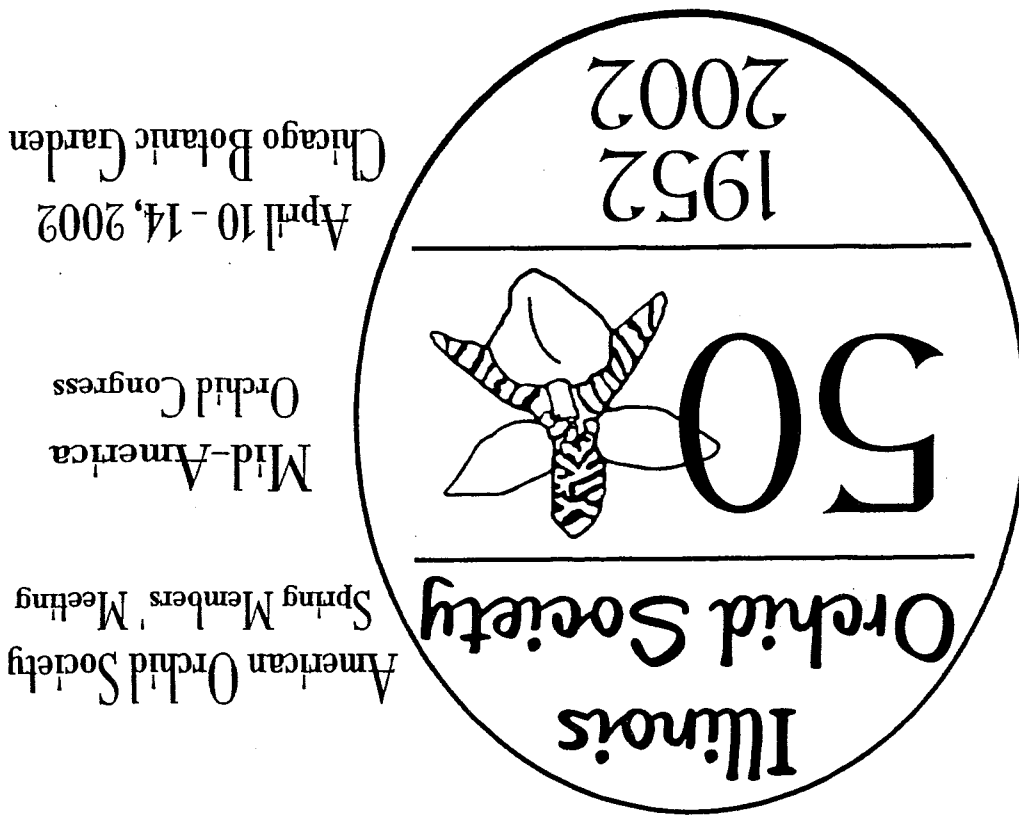
